The death of H. A. Richardson, one of the best known financiers in Canada, occurred on Friday last at Toronto. He was 61 years of age and since 1911 had filled the position of general manager of the Bank of Nova Scotia. Mr. Richardson entered the service of the bank when 18 years of age and was highly esteemed by the shareholders and the public generally. Among fellow bankers he was recognized as a man of excellent judgement, who knew the technical part of the business throughout. He is survived by a widow, two sons and a daughter. Mrs. C. R. H. Starr and Miss Richardson, of this town, are sisters.

Amongst those who recently passed their examinations for the Bar at Dalhousie University, we notice the name of Mr. Cecil Wray Townshend of this town, youngest son of Sir Charles Townshend, former Chief Justice of Nova Scotia. Mr. Townshend is also a graduate in Arts of McGill University, Montreal. Although hardly old enough, while pursuing his studies at McGill, he enlisted and went across to France, and took part in the Great War from which he returned at the conclusion of peace and began study of his legal education at Dalhousie, which he has just completed, and on Friday last was with some others admitted to the bar before Judge Russell. As we understand Mr. Townshend proposes to practice his profession in this county, we bespeak for him every success.
