

The carpenter who kept his acents on a plank and receipted them with a plane, was hardly equal in senuity to the Aztecs, who managed with string. The numbers were incated by knots. A single knot was en, two single knots 20, and so on. hundreds were indicated by ouble knots. The color of the tring indicated what the numbers eferred to. Soldiers were red, gold ellow, silver, white and corn green. This method is still in use on the elerras of the Argentine, where the in a similar way. Several strands depend from one, the first of these strands being reserved for bulls, the next for cows, the milch and dry being differentiated, the next for sheep and so on.

Knots were probably among the first methods of man to record figures -the knot or the mark on a bit of stick. And in the hop gardens the tallyman (generally the local schoolmaster) goes around with the tally and its mark, and the most civilated of us still tie a knot in the handkerchief when we are asked "to be sure and remember."

New Words Needed
