

H. B. COMPANY OFFERING PRIZES FOR AD DESIGN

The Hudson's Bay company will commemorate the 247th year since incorporation, and in this connection have decided to stage a somewhat unique competition in order to secure a suitable design for newspaper advertising window and store cards, booklets, posters, etc. During the occasion approximately 15 Hudson's Bay stores throughout Canada will feature this design. The competition will be between all the stores, and it would, no doubt, be somewhat of a credit to Calgary to have the design originate from this city.

The design in question should measure seven newspaper columns in width and not more than three inches in depth. It should be descriptive of the growth of the company since incorporation in 1670. In connection with the design there should be a border that will surround a full newspaper advertisement. The H. B. Co. are offering three prizes for this work, \$5, \$10 and \$15, and in addition are prepared to pay at the rate of \$2 for any further drawings they may use.

The date set as the last day on which drawings can be received is March 20, and they must be mailed or delivered to the advertising manager, Hudson's Bay store, Calgary, Alberta. Drawings will be in pen and ink only.
