The Workmen's Compensation Board

In the Royal Gazette, published ast week, the annual notice of assess ment rates upon industries coming within the provisions of the Act are published by the Workmen's Compen sation Board of New Brunswick.

Seven classes are included in the extended notices which fill several columns of the official governmental publication, the Act under which the Board operates requiring that the rates for the ensuing year be pub lished before January 1st.

Chairman John A. Sinclair, explain ing the publication of the rates, said that the schedule was provisional only and was liable to extensive aiterations, as they were dependent upon the requirements of the Board. He said that the only increase in rates that he recalled was that for logging and woods operations, which was advanced from 3 to 4 per cent. but pointed out that the rate for pulp and saw mills was reduced from






