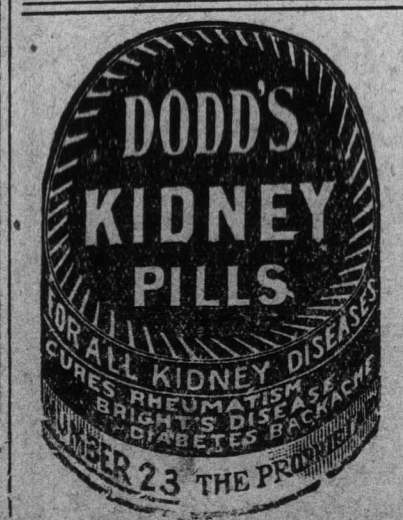
## Holy Name Society.
