AMSTERDAM, Dec. 2.

The Pope's dispatch to the Maasdo-

de, in response to Cardinal

Gasperri, Papal

representative, has been

received by the German

Government. The Pope

declares that the

war manifested

itself as a tragedy

which he begged the

belligerents to

abandon their aim of

destruction. "Equally,

under

circumstances," the

Pope continues, "he

has appealed to

the belligerents to

show a more

constructive attitude

toward

the peace nego-

tiations, so that a just and honor-

able peace may be attained."

PUBLICITY.

PARIS, Dec. 2.

It is reported that an agreement has

been reached by the Allied Govern-

ments for the issue, daily, during the

Congress, of an official com-

munications regarding the delibera-

tions of the Congress.

WASHINGTON, D.C., Dec. 2.

The President's purpose to attend

the Conference, and give his

message to the part the Government

will play in dealing with after-the-

war problems. Democrats of the

House received the announcement

with interest. The Republicans were

skeptical. The President referred to the

efficiency of the American

army and mentioned the names of

several members, who disappro-

ved of the trip, and of the President's

decision to include a Senator among

the delegates, however, did not

comment.
