We scarcely dreamed that the Tories of South Greuville would carry their bigotry and religious intolerance to the extent which they are now doing. We know that before Mr. Fraser's nomination by the Reform Convention, at its candidate for the late election, the Tories were moving heaven and carth to prevent his being the nominee, and all because of his being a Roman Catholic; we know that to gain this end they were willing to take a Protestant Reformer and give him their full support in order to defeat Mr. Fraser; we knew that to more than one, or two, or three of the leading Reformers advances of this kind were made only to be rejected with contempt; but even knowing all this, we could not bring ourselves until now to the belief that intolerance and illiberality obtained so much among them, that simply and solely because of Mr. Fraser's religion, they would resort to their last card—a protest—to harass and annoy him, and if possible defeat his election. Yet so it is, and we trust our Roman Catholic friends here and elsewhere will be ar it in mind.

The Tories are so liberal and fair minded, that they would have allowed a Protestant Reformer to have taken South Grenville at the late election by acclamation, but under no circumstances, with their consent, will a Roman Catholic be permitted to represent the constituency. If Roman Catholics can look with indifference upon this treatment of their correligionists, they will prove more charitable and more indifferent than human mature is generally credited for.—Brockville Reporter.
