The Legislature

Opposition Still Attacking the Redistribution Bill.

Meredith Alleges Injustice to His Own City—Toronto.

Number of Amendments Submitted—Calling the Government Hard Names.

PARLIAMENT HOUSE, Toronto, May 3.—Continuing the debate on the Registration Bill, Mr. Meredith's suggestions were set in number:

Names appearing on the last revised list of those who have ceased to be qualifications necessary to entitle them to vote may be struck off upon proper being given.

The chairman of the board of registrars shall be chosen by the members of the board and not appointed by the Lieutenant-Governor.

The registrars for the several divisions of a city shall be assigned by the board of registrars, and not by the Lieutenant-Governor.

In the first registration for Toronto names of all persons appearing on the list as prepared by the city clerk and the board of registrars respectively, shall be entered upon the list of voters.

Where a city is divided into electoral districts, actual residence in the electoral district at the time of the dissolution of the House or the issue of a writ for a special election, as the case may be, and the months previous continuous residence in the city, shall be sufficient residential qualification for registration.

If a person is absent from business during working hours for the purpose of registration he shall not be liable to deduction in wages.

The morning session, which commenced at 11:20, Mr. Hardy stated how far the Government were willing to go towards meeting the suggestions of the Opposition. The bill will be amended so as to allow the board to appoint its own chairman.

If a person is absent from the city at the time of registration he will be allowed—providing he establishes his right to such consideration—to appear before the registrar at a later date when, if he is entitled to a vote, his name will be placed on a supplementary list. Further than these particulars the Government is not prepared at present to go, and so the debate proceeded.

PARLIAMENT HOUSE, Toronto, May 3.—Members of the Legislature were a little sleepy to-day, but that did not prevent them from a strict attention to business. The greater part of all three sessions were devoted to scrutinizing the various provisions of the Registration Bill in committee. After the Government had completed the amendments, the Opposition was somewhat appeased and a dispassionate scrutiny of the bill resulted.

Mr. Ross added a clause providing that a registrar or registrar's clerk should be eligible as a candidate for election in a constituency for which they had prepared the list.

The suggestion of Mr. Meredith that the names of members of the registration board, which were to have been appointed by the Lieutenant-Governor, should be elected by the board itself, was rejected.

The number of registration booths in Toronto was increased from 16 to 24.

The clause relating to the photographing of a person suspected of attempting to vote was struck out.

The committee rose and the bill was reported as amended at 11:45. The amendments were then concurred in and the bill was read a third time to-morrow.

Mr. Meredith consented to the second reading of Mr. Gibson's Redistribution Bill without discussion, and any debate that may arise will take place at a later stage. The leader of the Opposition intimated that he would attack the provisions in respect to Ottawa. The House adjourned at 11:50.

PARLIAMENT BUILDINGS, Toronto, May 4.—The Redistribution Bill was debated in committee this morning. Mr. Clarke (Toronto) criticised the division of this city into electoral districts.

He stated, South Toronto had 50 per cent more voters than the North Toronto. Mr. Gibson, Provincial Secretary, thought that the proposed division into North, South, East and West Toronto was preferable to dividing the city into four constituencies, running from the northern to the southern boundaries of the municipality. He held that it could reasonably be expected that North Toronto would grow in accordance with the continued removal of business men for residential purposes to the outskirts of the city, but South Toronto would not likely be subject to much electoral expansion.
