Roma Plunges To Earth and Explodes At Norfolk Army Base.

FLAMES RETARD RESCUE

Three or Four More Bodies Still Believed To Be in Charred Wreckage.

NORFOLK, Va., Feb. 21.-Flung rudder, the giant army airship Roma plunged a thousand feet or Falls and a score or more municimore today to strike ground at the palities throughout Western Ontario Hampton Roads army base, capsize across a high-tension electric line passengers perished. Many hours after her fall the ship

vas still an inferno of flames from end to end of her 410-foot mass. The fire was feeding on the million cubic feet of gas that had distended the

score men aboard had been picked up One died en route to a hosfire escaped by jumping as the ship struck. The others, penned in the hull beneath the fallen bag, were burned to death. The heat of the fire fought back the rescuers for hours. to get in touch with the Toronto com

Three fire departments fought the flames with chemicals and by 7 p.m. plant at Niagara Falls. As the Bell it was conquered. Derricks began picking up the wreckage as the flames were driven back.
