TO authorise the Grand Jurors, of the se-
 veral Counties within this Province,
 to examine, audit and allow the Public Ac-
 counts.
 I BE IT ENACTED, by the Lieutenant
 Governor, Legislative Council, and Assem-
 bly, that once in each year at the General
 Sessions of the Peace, in each County in this
 Province, it shall be the duty of the Justices
 of the Peace, to cause a full particular and
 detailed account, of all receipts and expen-
 diture of public moneys, within such Coun-
 ties for the past year, to be laid before the
 Grand Jury, at the General Sessions of the
 Peace, and it shall be the duty of the said
 Grand Jury, to examine and audit the said
 accounts, and to allow the same if they shall
 see fit.—Provided always, and be it further
 enacted, that no assessments shall be made
 or money raised for the payment of any
 account or accounts, not so examined, au-
