No straw offering. Pork was unchanged, worth \$8.50 to \$9.75. Choice butter was scarce and firm, but there is an abundance of ordinary coming in, for which prices are easier. Pound rolls range from 20c. to 25c. Eggs are plentiful for the season, and new laid are bought at 16c. to 17c. by the basket.
