




Medal at the Paris Universal Exhibition, 1867, IN COMPETITION WITH THE WORLD.

THE FRENCH PREMIER.

Clement Armand Fallieres, the new Premier, is scarcely more than forty-one years old. He was born at Metz, in the Department of Lot-et-Garonne, on November 6th, 1841. He studied law, and was admitted to the bar of Metz, of which city he became Mayor, retaining the place up to the 25th of May, 1873. He presented himself as a candidate for the Chamber of Deputies on the Republican ticket in February, 1876, and was elected by a vote of 8,376 to 6,442 for his Bonapartist opponent, in the arrondissement of Metz. In the Chamber of Deputies he took his seat with the faction known as the Republican Left, and soon made his mark as an orator. He was one of the 863 Deputies of the United Left who voted against the De Broglie Ministry after the reactionary movement of May, 1877. At the ensuing general election, in October of that year, he was re-elected to the Chamber of Deputies, receiving 8,953 votes to 6,810 cast for M. Dufaure, who had been a Deputy under the Empire and had the support of the Government. In the new Chamber of Deputies he cast his lot with the same faction of the Republicans, and added to his reputation by a frequent display of oratorical ability of a high order. In August last he made his first appearance in official position, being selected by M. Ducloux to succeed M. Goblet as Minister of the Interior, which post is, all things considered, the most difficult and influential after the Premiership itself. He now reaches the highest place itself at an age almost, if not quite, unparalleled in the annals of France. M. Fallieres is an influential man in the neighborhood of his home, and for some years has represented the canton of Netao in the Council-General of the Department of Lot-et-Garonne, a part of the old province of Gasconne.

BUREAU DE TABAC.

The statement has been made that Gen. Ohanzay's widow will receive from the French Government, in addition to a pension, a grand bureau de tabac. Not only is the growth and manufacture of tobacco under state control, but the sale of it is equally so. Only a certain number of shops for the retail of tobacco are permitted, and they must be sufficiently far apart from each other to make the proprietorship of one substantially remunerative. The bureaux de tabac in France are bestowed upon servants in reduced circumstances, and more frequently still upon their widows. They are, however, the cause of much intriguing, and the enemies of the Government often discover, or think they discover, a scandal in a tobacco shop. The system usually adopted by those who are so fortunate as to obtain a bureau de tabac in a good situation is to employ others to look after the business, while reserving to themselves the disposal of the profits.
