Activating and Closing Shortcut Menus




Figure 1-5: The Taskbar Shortcut Menu

Clicking the left mouse button in Windows NT selects items. Clicking the right mouse button, however, displays special shortcut menus, such as the Taskbar shortcut menu illustrated in Figure 1-5. The shortcut menu you see depends on which area of the screen or which icon you right-click. Shortcut menus are sometimes called *context menus* because the options available on those menus depends on what you are doing at the time you access them.

Note: Remember that if you switched the mouse buttons, you will have to use the left mouse button to activate and close shortcut menus.

- METHOD --

To activate a shortcut menu:

- 1. Point to the object you want to use.
- 2. Right-click the mouse.

To close a shortcut menu:

- 1. Point outside the shortcut menu.
- 2. Click the left mouse button.
