

Kenneth Douglas McIlwraith

Mr. McIlwraith was born in Toronto on May 25, 1917. He obtained a B.A. and an M.A. from Cambridge University in 1939/40. After serving with the Allied Forces in the Middle East and Norway during the war, he undertook post-graduate studies in history at the University of Toronto in 1947/48.

Mr. McIlwraith joined the Department of External Affairs in 1948. He has served in the Canadian Permanent Mission to the United Nations in Geneva, in our Embassy in Tokyo and was counsellor in Paris from 1964 to 1966. In Canada Mr. McIlwraith has headed the Disarmament Division from 1961 to 1964 and he is currently Head of the Security Services Division of the Department.

Mr. McIlwraith is married and has four children.

DAVID CHALMER REECE

Mr. Reece was born in Winnipeg on February 14, 1926. He attended Cambridge University where he received a B.A. (Honours) in 1949. He studied law at the Inns of Court and was called to the bar in 1951.

After working in England for a short time, Mr. Reece joined the Department of External Affairs in 1952. He has served abroad in several posts including Bonn, London, Kuala Lumpur and New Delhi. His most recent posting, from 1969 to 1971, was as Minister and Deputy Permanent Representative to the United Nations, New York. In Ottawa Mr. Reece has worked in the Offices of the Under-Secretary and the Secretary of State for External Affairs, as well as in the External Aid Office and the African and Middle Eastern Division.

Mr. Reece is married and has three children.
