BILL 2.

An Act respecting Thanksgiving Day.

HIS Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Senate and House of Commons of Canada, enacts as follows:—

Thanksgiving Day to be held on second Monday of November in each year.

Interpretation Act and Bills of Exchange Act amended.

1. The annual thanksgiving day, heretofore held on a day fixed by proclamation of the Governor in Council, shall 5 hereafter be held on the second Monday of November in each year, as a perpetual memorial of the victorious conclusion of the recent war, in addition to such other reasons as may be prescribed by proclamation of the Governor in Council for that purpose published; and paragraph (11) of 10 section thirty-four of the *Interpretation Act*, and paragraph (a) of section forty-three of the *Bills of Exchange Act*, chapters one, and one hundred and nineteen, of the Revised Statutes of Canada, 1906, are amended by adding "Thanksgiving Day" to the lists of holidays and non-juridical days, 15 mentioned in the said paragraphs.
