Mr. Denis Pronovost (Saint-Maurice): Mr. Speaker, we just listened with great interest to a lively discussion between two real socialists. The NDP are clearly socialists, but the socialists in the Liberal Party do not always come across as the real thing.

In any case, Monique Bégin, once a member of cabinet under the Liberal government, said after the Budget was brought down that people should ignore the Liberal Opposition her own friends and stop listening to them because what they were saying about the Budget wasn't true. Mrs. Bégin said, the day after the Budget was brought down, that Mr. Wilson's latest budget did not in any way affect our medicare system in this country.

I think the hon. member should listen to this former minister who was part of the Trudeau government. Now that she has retired from the partisan side of political life, she tells us quite clearly: "Don't listen to the Liberal Opposition. They want to scare people". Just like the Liberals scared senior citizens in my riding, in Saint-Maurice, during the last federal election campaign, when they said: If you vote for the Conservatives and free

trade, all old age pensions in Saint-Maurice will be scrapped.

The Liberals are using the same kind of scare tactics again, but I think Canadians will ignore them and maintain their confidence in our national medicare system, a system we want to maintain and preserve for the years to come.
