The amendment made by the Senate to the Bill No. 166, an Act in further amend-

ment of the Fisheries Act, was taken into consideration, and agreed to.

The House proceeded to take into consideration the reasons given by the Honourable the Senate for insisting on the seventh, eight, ninth and tenth of their amendments to Bill No. 16, an Act to repeal the Electoral Franchise Act, and to further amend the Dominion Elections Act.

Mr. Fitzpatrick moved, That the House do not insist on its disagreement to the seventh, eight, ninth and tenth amendments made by the Senate to the said Bill, but agree thereto,—and that a Message be sent to the Senate to acquaint their Honours therewith.

The House went again into Committee of Supply.
