Religion, but fuch as the Priefts of the Romifh Church were pleafed to give her: fhe judged according to the Light fhe had; and if fhe was miftaken, it is to be hoped that the Lord will forgive her on account of the falfe guide, who have hid the truth from her and taught her falfhoods.

But for fear that this Confideration alone would not prevail enough upon you; He endeavours to frighten you with the danger of dying a Protestant, by the example of *Calvin*, who he fays, repented on his Death-bed, of having feparated himfelf from the Church of *Rome*. It is *Varillas* a Papist who gives this out: *Beza* a Reformer, in his Life of *Calvin* denies it, and *Papyrius Maffon*, tho' a Papist declares himfelf against the Calumnies which *Boljec* and other Enemies of *Calvin* gave out against him.

I perceive Madam, that I am quoting Authors that are unknown to you; but you may lay the blame of it upon Mr. Seguenot, who amufes you with Stories, into the truth of which you can never examine, and which for that reafon he thould only have mentioned as doubtful facts.

He feems to have thought himfelf obliged likewife to attack the Character of *Luther*, that he may blacken our two greateft Reformers : And as the fame fable had never been invented about him, as about *Calvin*, that is, that he repented his having quitted the Church of *Rome*, Mr. Seguenot finds himfelf reduced to attack him upon another topick, that of his Marriage; upon which he fays feveral things that are very far from being true. As in the first place, that *Luther* took *Catharine de Bore* out of her Convent to make her his Wife. This is not true : She and eight more Nuns, left their Convent of their own accord, affisted in their escape by a Senator and fome honest Citizens of the Town : *Luther* was not
