Twenty-Three Runners Won Thirty-One Races, Worth Thirty-Nine Thousand Dollars.

NEW YORK, Dec. 15 .- That American ace horses can hold their own with those now coming over from England and France in such large numbers to compete here next season is indicated pretty clearly by the performances abroad of horses from the United States. Twenty-three of these won thirty-one races in England, accounting for something more than \$55,000 in purses and stakes.

Danger Rock, the three-year-old son of Rock sand and Deitsson, by Meduler, Was the most successing of the lot. He won the Hastings rate in a held of eight at Newmarket last spring, and when he followed up this victory by defeating Leftly and Tournament in the Newmarket stakes he became second choice for the new Derby. After running only three-races he broke down in the Ze land Plate and had to be taken off the course in all ambulance. He was bred and is owner by August Belmont.




