CURRENT TRADE CONDITIONS.

ONTARIO.

The developments of the past week have but borne out the prediction that there would be a firm market for lumber throughout the winter months. We are told of the visit, even at this early date, of Chicago and eastern buyers to the mills in the Georgian Bay district for the purpose of picking up suitable lots of dry stock and of arranging for a supply for spring shipment. Already a large percentage of the white pine cut of the coming season has been placed under contract, and we have reason to believe that the prices have been very favorable to the seller.

The Ottawa Valley production of deals for the British market, which will be less in quantity than last year, has to a large extent been purchased by the middlemen. W. & J. Sharples have secured the Edwards and Hawkesbury cuts; Watson & Todd the Armprior cut of McLachlan Bros.; Cox & Company the cut of McLaren & Company, Buckingham; The McArthur Export Company the cut of Gilles Bros.; Braeside; Duncan, Ewing & Company the cut of McLaurin & McLaren, East Templeton, and Dobell, Beckett & Company and W. & J. Sharples the cut of the Three Rivers mills. The balance of the cuts are under negotiation and will no doubt be immediately contracted for. The price, in nearly every case, represents an advance on last year's figures.

In hemlock and hardwoods the market is steadily gaining strength and seems likely to reach a higher basis for the 1903 production. Some classes of hardwood lumber are so scarce that dealers have abandoned all efforts to find a stock sufficiently large to handle at a profit, and are devoting their attention to placing contracts for the new cut.

QUEBEC AND NEW BRUNSWICK.

Quebec spruce lumber is being contracted for quite freely, a large portion of the deal production having already been purchased at an advance on last year's prices. On account of the increased cost of logging there seems little probability that the cut will be any larger than last year, while by some it is predicted that the quantity of logs taken out for lumber will this season show a reduction. The increased cost of stumpage will also tend to sustain prices. The figures of the Miramichi lumber trade have been given out. The total shipments for the season were 122,000,000 feet, a decrease of 7,000,000 feet as compared with the previous year. The
