Number would amount to very near three Hundredis And no Wonders that they who were en tirely ignorant of the real Source of human Mifery should be at a Loss in discovering the true Method to redress it. They all saw clearly that Man, in his present State of Impersection, frail, and abounding even from within himself with numberless Causes of Evil and Sorrow, could never. have originally come thus framed out of the Hands. of a perfect Creator. One of them calls him the Child of a Step-mother, rather than of a kind indulgent Parent: Others, imagin'd the Body to be a Prison, into which the Soul was committed by way of Punishment for Transgressions committed in some former State; whence the Opinions: of Præ-existence, and Transmigration of Souls, the Parents of infinite Superstition and Folly in the Pagan Worship, took Rife, and prevailed generally among the Followers of Pythagoras and Plato. And yet it is observable, that whenever a. Ray of Light shone in upon the Mind through all this Ignorance and Darkness, so as to let the Truth in upon it, we find the Soul naturally foaring towards Heaven, and placing all her folid Hopes of Happiness there. The wifest and most admired among the Ancients agree, that Happiness is only to be acquired by living according to the Rules of Virtue; which Plate and his Followers derive from God; and therefore found their Happines
