

2. Members shall be persons whose pursuits or studies are connected with the Arts and Sciences, or who are desirous of forwarding the objects of the Institute.

3. Corresponding Members shall be persons residing out of the Province, whose pursuits are similar to those of Members.

4. Members for life shall be persons who may make donations of £10 in money, books, or specimens for the Museum (the two latter to be valued by competent persons), or who may be elected as such at the Annual General Meeting of the Institute, for important services performed, and after due notice has been given, as in the case of alteration of the laws.

5. Honorary Members shall be persons of high standing, who are eminent for their scientific attainments.

6. The number of Honorary Members shall be limited to twenty-five.

7. The Officers of the Institute shall consist of a President; a First, Second, and Third Vice-President; a Treasurer; Corresponding and Recording Secretaries; Librarian and Curator,—all of whom shall be elected annually, and shall be re-eligible.
