But as it may be expedient for the Members of this Society to move, in quest of settlement, to other parts of this Continent or elsewhere, where similar Institutions exist, whose countenance and support may be of great assistance to them, a second form of Certificate shall be given on application, to such Members of this description as the Society shall deem worthy of the same, the form to be as follows:

XX. The foregoing Constitution and Rules shall be deemed the Fundamental articles of the Nova-Scotia Philanthropic Society of Halifax, and shall not be altered or abrogated on any pretence whatever; otherwise than by consent of at least two thirds of the Members at the Annual Meeting. Provided however, that a Committee of seven Members has been previously appointed, and their unanimous report states such alterations to be necessary.
