The reason for this is said to be due to the fact that the same storm that caused such demoralization to the drovers made it difficult for them to get their cattle to work to advantage in the forwarding of their products, added to which the past week has, it is said, been one of the worst in months in local trading, and buyers are naturally disinclined to load up in view of the unsettled conditions.

Looked at in this way, the decline seems a logical one. We will in the opinion of the market, have a big run on Monday, and just what the market will do then is problematical, and only time can tell.
