McFee & Co., grain exporters, of Montreal, has been a visitor in Winnipeg for the past few days. In an interview "I think the farmers of the Canadian west are unduly anxious as to getting

"As long as the wheat is in the farmers' account in country elevators, it does not figure in the visible supply, and is, therefore, not a depressing factor, in the world's markets. Prices of Canadian wheat would be sure to suffer from any heavy increase in the visible supply, much more in proportion than American, for the simple reason that Canada's home consumption is relatively small in proportion to her production, while in the United States the surplus for export is small in comparison with their home consumption. I consider the outlook is for steady export at reasonable prices."

Speaking of widening the market for Canadian wheat, he said:

"I think it would be quite in order for the government as a general policy be subsidize steamship lines for carrying our product beyond the seas, just as they have in the past subsidized rallways to carry produce to the sea, board."
