KYLE LOSES HIS SUIT

Against the City of Toronto—Other Cases—To-Day's Proceedings. The Master in Chambers at Osgoode Hall has ordered the City Solicitor to show cause why an appeal should not be taken before the County Judge to attach Inspector Archibald's salary to the City of Toronto.
