Dear Miss Grey,—I have an American friend who is in the navy with the coast guards in American waters, I would like to send him a box, but don't know if boxes are allowed to be sent. Would you please let me know if possible, as I would like very much to know. I will send a recipe for pumpkin marmalade for "Irish Girl." It is one I cut out of your page last winter, and it is good. I will also send recipe for red cabbage for "Mother of Four Girls and Two Boys." Hope this will be a little help.

Pumpkin Marmalade.—Cut 8 pounds
of yellow pumpkin into small pleces and
mix with 9 pounds sugar. Let stand 12 hours. Then peel 6 oranges and 6 lemons, boil rind of 2 oranges and 2 lemons for two hours, changing water two or three times, then cut off as much of white as possible to prevent bitterness. Chop remainder of rind and odd to rest of fruit, and holl two or

add to rest of fruit, and boil two or three hours; put in jars and keep in three hours; put in jars and keep in dark place.

Red Cabbage.—Have vinegar, sugar and spices on stove hot, then chop cabbage and put in the vinegar, scald slightly, put it in crock and turn a plate over it and it will keep all winter. I use whole pickling spice and tie them in a thin rag or cheesecloth.

Ans.—Yes, parcels may be sent to sailors in the American coast guards. A parcel of seven pounds or less may be mailed, the cost being 16 cents a pound. This information is given out by the London postoffice.




