World subscribers in Hamilton are requested to register complaints as to... BARKER AND STEWART BY LARGE MAJORITIES Former is Thousand Ahead and Landers Loses His Deposit—Mayor Ousts Zimmerman.

HAMILTON, Oct. 26.—(Special.)—The Conservatives made a clean sweep in Hamilton to-day, retaining East Hamilton by a greatly increased majority and capturing West Hamilton. Samuel Barker, ex-M.P., in the eastern riding, increased his majority of 241 in the last election to 346, defeating J. M. Eastwood, Liberal, and Samuel Landers, Labor. He had pluralities in each of the three wards, the vote being as follows: Ward one—Barker 525, Eastwood 469, Landers 145. Ward six—Barker 1051, Eastwood 460, Landers 497. Ward seven—Barker 1404, Eastwood 776, Landers 607. Total—Barker 2980, Eastwood 1875, Landers 1309. Plurality for Barker, 1105.

The surprise of the contest was the poor run made by Landers. As he did not poll half as many votes as the successful candidate he will lose his deposit of \$200. He took his defeat with good grace. In West Hamilton, Mayor Stewart turned the Liberal majority of 234 in the last election into a Conservative majority of 393. He ran ahead of his opponent in every ward but two, the vote by wards being: Ward two—Stewart 620, Zimmerman 702. Ward three—Stewart 1021, Zimmerman 880. Ward four—Stewart 1025, Zimmerman 704. Ward five—Stewart 6098, Zimmerman 685. Total—Stewart 3384, Zimmerman 2871. Stewart's majority, 393.

The Conservatives celebrated the victory by marching through the city headed by the 13th Regiment Band. There was the usual display of torches and fireworks. Their candidates made speeches, in which they thanked the voters.
