SHORT GRASS TAKES PIMLICO HANDICAP

Emil Herz's Horse Favorite in
Feature Event—Benevolent
a Winner.

Pimlico Track, Baltimore, Md., Nov. 10.—The Mirasol Stables two-year-old bay filly by Hessian-Saccharine, which raced all summer on the Canadian circuit, got out of the maiden class today, when she beat Daybreak and Bar of Phoenix handily. The winner paid a good price, \$27.50 for \$2, and was ridden by the apprentice jockey Lyke. R. F. Carman's Bright Star, the favorite, was unplaced.

The Bowie Handicap, at 1 1/2 miles, was won by the favorite, Emil Herz's Short Grass, with 128 pounds up. Airman, an added starter, ridden by the apprentice jockey Crump, was second and Half Rock third. The results:—
