## BRITISH LABOR WINS IN HAMMERSMITH

First By-Election Since End of General Strike is Landslide

LONDON, May 28.—The Hammersmith, by-election first voting in England since the general strike resulted in a landslide for the Laborite candidate, J. P. Gardner, who was elected to the House of Commons over his Conservative opponent, S. G. Luckhurst, by a vote of 13,085 to 9,484.

## KINGS CO. SCHOOLS MEET ON JUNE 3

Keen Competition Expected at Sussex For The Bolton Shield

The Kings county interscholastic track and field meet, to be held in Sussex on June 3, is expected to produce some keen competition, especially between the old rivals, Rotherham Consolidated and Sussex. Hampton also will make a strong bid for the Bolton shield. In the meet this year, the Bolton shield will be up for the fourth time. Previous to this, Hampton, Rotherham and Kingston competed for the Pugsley cup. In 1923 Sussex was admitted and G. P. Bolton, of Sussex, donated a handsome shield. This is for annual competition, until one school wins it for three successive years, or any five years. Rotherham won the meet in 1923, with 68½ points; Hampton, 35½; Sussex, 28; Kingston, 6. In 1924 Sussex won it, scoring 54 points; Rotherham, 38½; Hampton, 14; Kingston, 3. In 1925 Sussex successfully defended the shield with a total of 67½ points; Rotherham, 47½; Hampton, 10½; Kingston, 7.

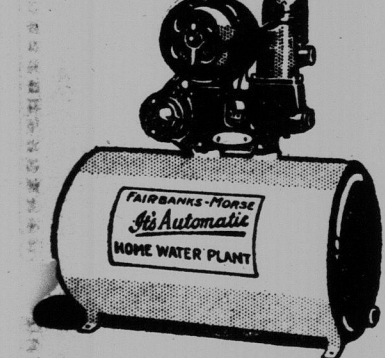

## \$29,000 IS SPENT ON GIRL IN YEAR

Guardian of Dorothy Gordon, Massachusetts Heiress, Files Second Accounting

BOSTON, Mass., May 29.—A sum in excess of \$29,000 has been expended in one year on Miss Dorothy D. Gordon, 25-year-old heiress, over whose guardianship a long legal battle was waged in Massachusetts courts two years ago, according to the second accounting of Attorney John M. O'Donoghue of Lowell, guardian, filed in Middlesex Probate Court.

Whether the \$29,919.97 was spent in one grand round of flowers, fun and romance cannot be gleaned from the accounting which is extremely brief and in no way comparable to the detailed accounting rendered last year. Whereas last year the report showed expenditures of between \$15 and \$20 a month to cater to Dorothy's "sweet tooth," and monthly payments to Calvin the Florist of \$30 to cheer her with flowers, no individual items are set forth in the report just filed. Last year it was shown that Boston and out-of-town specialists made a huge dent in the expense account, whereas this time an amount of \$5,083.23 is set forth for medical attention and nursing services.

A meagre sum of \$317.28 is set forth for clothing.

Household expenses are listed at \$10,183.84, and legal services at \$1,558.85.

Longest Escalator.

London has the world's longest escalator, or moving staircase, at the tube station at Oxford Circus. The

length of the stairs is 122 feet, width four feet, and its descent from the street level is 34 feet. A wooden box runs the whole length, this being covered with carpet to prevent hastening

passengers from sliding down, but the "box" is really stone steps, enabling engineers to repair the escalator with celerity in case of breakdown. The escalator carries 75,000 persons a day.
