



PLOTS AGAINST THE BRITISH

Washington, June 18—Details of much-heralded uprisings in the Mohammedan world against British rule and in favor of the Turkish Nationalists and Bolsheviki were received here yesterday in official advices. The reports confirm advices as to Moscow and Munich conferences received some time ago by the United States state department. Enver Pasha, Djemal Pasha and Talaat Pasha, Turkish Nationalist leaders, were reported to have conferred with Spartacists and Bolsheviki at Munich, while representatives from India, Egypt, Afghanistan, Persia, Azerboijhan and Georgia met Turkish Nationalists and Lenine, Bolsheviki leader, at Moscow.

AT ST. JOHN FAIR The outline of a programme for a public welfare exhibit in connection with the St. John exhibition, was discussed yesterday afternoon, at a meeting in the office of the mayor, City Hall, which was attended by representatives of the provincial department of public health, the provincial Red Cross, the Victorian Order of Nurses, the Anti-Tuberculosis Society, the St. John Ambulance Association, the St. John Ambulance Brigade, and the Child Welfare Exhibit Committee of the Local Council of Women.

Roberts, M.D., minister of health for the province, said the Red Cross, at the close of the great war, had formed a peace policy even more exacting than that of wartime, and he thought that the other projects are reliable. exacting than that of wartime, and he thought that the other societies which are interested directly in the matter of public health should give the matter of a welfare exhibit their guidance and assistance. To make this exhibit the success it should be, he wanted the co-operation of all societies and organizations interested directly in public health and he would be thankful for any suggestions and organization interested at length to the public welfare exhibit at Montreal, which comprises some twenty or more different booths or sections, devoted to all phases of health, sanitation, hyglene and home affairs, from pre-natal influence to mothers' persions. He suggested that something along similar lines would be the nature of the St. John show and asked all the societies directly interested in the matter to appoint one representative, who will report to him at a later date.




