WOMAN AND CHURCH

Bishop of New York Says English Episcopal Body Leads in Recognition.

(New York Times.)

The Church of England stands far in advance of the Protestant Episcopal church in America in its recognition of women in the church, according to the Right Rev. Charles S. Burch, Bishop of New York. Bishop Burch expressed this opinion yesterday afternoon in the course of a sermon on "The Lambeth Conference," at the Cathedral of St. John the Divine. The great cathedral was so crowded that several hundred late comers were seated in the choir stalls within the chancel.

Bishop Burch affirmed that "in the minds of many millions of Christian folk the most vitally compelling and appealing accomplishment of the conference was the report, the appeal and the conclusions reached on the crying question of the reunion of Christendom. It was nothing less than a miracle, that first, the large committee of

entirely composed of bishops of every type and color of churchmanship, and then the entire conference should reach with practical unanimity the decision which today is stirring the Christian world," said Bishop Burch.

"The conference," he continued, "sent forth the most remarkable moving and forthright to other Christian bodies as yet promulgated to a disunited and sadly dismembered Christian world."
