DEPARTMENT OF HIGHWAYS
TENDERS FOR
FIREGUARDS
SEALED TENDERS to be addressed on
the envelope "Tenders for Fireguards"
and addressed to the Deputy Minister, Department
of Highways, Regina, will be received to 1
o'clock p.m. Saturday, June 29th, 1919, for
preparing the following fireguards, which in
the case of replanting must be ploughed to
the full width of original grade, which must
be at least sixteen feet in the case of single
guards and eight feet in the case of double
guards, all ploughing to be sufficient depth
to cut and cover grass, weeds, etc. In cases
where a new double guard is to be ploughed
on a road allowance, the sod must be turned
towards the centre of the road.
1809. Replanching single fireguard east of
townships 15, 12 and 11 township 9, range 1,
west of the third meridian, thence due north
east on township line north of township 2,
range 30, 29, 28, 27, 26 and 25, west of the
second meridian, thence due north to the east
end of Willow Branch Lake. Length about
64 miles.
1912. Replanching single fireguard from
the east end of Big Muddy Lake due south
two miles, thence in a south westerly direction
to about section 1, township 1, range 22, to
meet the American fireguard at the Interna-
tional boundary, all west of the 2nd meridian.
Length about 19 miles.
All tenders must be accompanied by a de-
posit of 5 per cent. of the contract price, such
deposit to be no more than Ten Dollars,
as a guarantee of good faith on the part of
the tenderer to enter into a contract for the
proper completion of the work. Tenders must
in all cases be based on a price per mile.
The date of completion given in the con-
tract forms is a very important part of said
contract, and work must be completed by that
date unless other arrangements are agreed
on. Payment will be subject and work made
by an inspector authorized by the Department
of Highways. Lowest or any tender not so
necessarily accepted.

CHAPTER V.
Tom Applies his Knife to the
Oyster.

The next day, at ten o'clock,

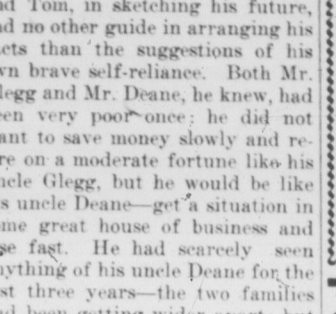
