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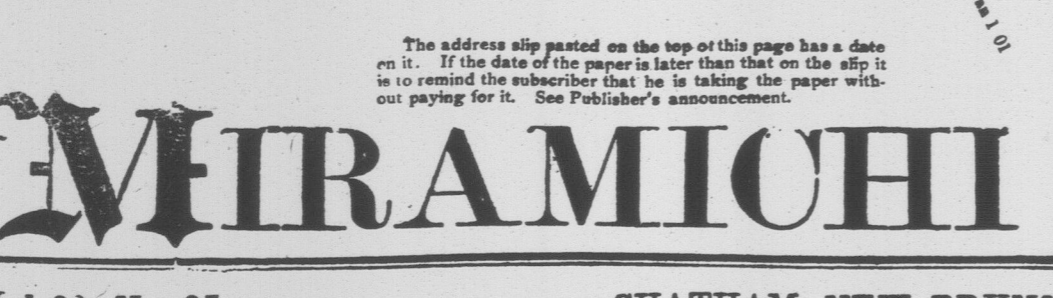

The New Postal Service In Use in European and American Cities.
