Fredericton. — The New Brunswick Provincial Police force w" be transferred to the Royal Canadam Mounted Police on April 1, Premier C. D. Richards, Attorney-General, announced. Outlining the change Promier Richards said an annual serving of between \$80,000 and \$100,-000 will be effected by it.

Under the agreement the R.C.M.P. will maintain a minimum for the office of 100 men in the Province of New Brunswick for which the profince will pay to Ottawa the sum of \$100,-000 a year. Premier Richards said that where the enforcement of provincial statute was concerned the New Brunswick division of the R.C.M.P. would be completely under the central of the Provincial Attorney-General. Captain E. C. P. Salt, commissioner of the Provincial Police, continuing as head of the new division. Buildings and other property of the Provincial Police will be taken over by the Dominion at a price agreed on between Dominion and Provincial Governments.

"I believe that all members of the provincial force now will be taken over by the R.C.M.P. in rank at the same equivalent they now hold" commented Captain Salt.
