RECIPES TO TRY

Here is how to make the Meat Loaf the Eggless Mayonnaise and the Zwieback Pie mentioned on the Menu you read last week in this column.

MEAT LOAF

1 pound ground raw meat. 1 egg. 1/2 cup finely chopped onion. 1/4 cups evaporated milk. 2 cups bread crumbs. Mix all ingredients thoroughly. Turn into a well greased baking pan, shape into a loaf and bake from 30 to 45 minutes in a moderately hot oven (375°F.). Serves eight.

EGGLESS MAYONNAISE

1/2 teaspoon salt. 1/2 teaspoon dry mustard. 1/2 teaspoon paprika. 1/2 teaspoon sugar. Few grains cayenne. 3 tablespoons evaporated milk. 1/2 cup salad oil. 2 tablespoons vinegar or 1 tablespoon lemon juice. Thoroughly mix dry ingredients. Add the milk, blend well and beat in the oil gradually. Add the vinegar, or vinegar and lemon juice, beating until mixture is smooth. Makes one cup of mayonnaise.

ZWIEBACK PIE CRUST

1 box zwieback (2 cups ground) 1/2 cup butter 1/2 cup brown sugar 1/2 teaspoon cinnamon Cream together butter and brown sugar. Add cinnamon an zwieback and blend thoroughly. Cover bottom of large deep pie tin with part of mixture and reserve rest for top of pie.

FILLING

3 eggs, separated 1/2 cup sugar 1-8 teaspoon salt 1 teaspoon vanilla 1 tablespoon cornstarch 1 cup evaporated milk 1 cup water Blend sugar, sugar and cornstarch. Add boiling water and boil until thick and transparent, stirring constantly. Beat egg yolks, add milk and stir slowly into starch mixture. Cook until mixture hangs from spoon. Add vanilla and pour into zwieback crust. Cover with meringue and top with remainder of zwieback mixture. Bake in a moderate oven until brown. Serves eight.

MERINGUE

1/2 teaspoon cream of tartar 6 tablespoon sugar Vanilla.

PICTOU GIRL NOTED SWIMMER

I., according to the Natural Resources Department of the Canadian National Railway. Prince Edward Island, the home of the black fox industry, still leads the other provinces of Canada in the number of adults and pups with Quebec second. In 1931 Prince Edward Island had 12,259 adults and 18,513 pups; Quebec had 9,260 adults and 11,338 pups; New Brunswick, 6,654 adults, pups 8,045; total for all Canada, adults 46,974, pups 53,607.

N.B.P.P. IS ABSORBED BY THE R.C.M.P.

Co-ordination of three services, Provincial Service, Mounted Police and Provincial Police. - Province to save from \$80,000 to \$100,000. - Force of 100 men.

STARTING APRIL 1st

Fredericton - The New Brunswick Provincial Police force will be transferred to the Royal Canadian Mounted Police on April 1. Provincial Police, Attorney-General announced, following the change, Premier Richards said an annual saving of between \$80,000 and \$100,000 will be effected by it.

Under the agreement the R.C.M.P. will maintain a minimum force of 100 men in the Province of New Brunswick for which the province will pay to Ottawa the sum of \$100,000 a year. Premier Richards said that where the enforcement of the provincial statute was concerned the New Brunswick division of the R.C.M.P. would be completely under the control of the Provincial Attorney-General, Captain E. C. P. Salt, commissioner of the Provincial Police, continuing as head of the new division. Buildings and other property of the Provincial Police will be taken over by the Dominion at a price agreed on between Dominion and Provincial Governments.

"I believe that all members of the provincial force now will be taken over by the R.C.M.P. in rank at the same equivalent they now hold," commented Captain Salt.
