The assessors shall ascertain as nearly as possible, the particulars of the real estate, the personal property, and the income of any person, who has not brought in a statement in accordance with their notice and as required by this law, and shall make an estimate thereof at the true value and amount, to the best of their information and belief, and such estimate shall be conclusive upon all persons who have not filed their statements in due time, unless they can show a reasonable excuse for the omission."

LODGE BACK AS SENATOR

Two Votes Cast by Democrats Gave Him Six More Than Needed to Elect

Boston, Mass., Jan. 19.—Senator Lodge was re-elected at a joint convention of the house and senate yesterday afternoon, receiving 146 votes, or six more than was required to elect, two of which were cast by Democrats.

Mr. Lodge received the votes of Representatives Fred P. Greenwood, of Everett, and Charles H. Arkwell, of Worcester who voted yesterday for Speaker Walker. Representative Killpatrick, of Lowell, who voted for Butler Ames, cast his ballot today for Senator Lodge.

Speaker Walker's letter of last evening to the four Republicans who voted for him, had the desired effect, and he received no votes in joint session. Russell A. Wood, of Cambridge, the representative who has been the leader of the anti-Lodge forces, voted for A. Lowell as did Representative Sylvester, of Worcester.

Two hundred and seventy-nine members of the legislature voted, the only absentee being Representative Alderney, of Middlebury, who was absent yesterday. Representative White, of Newton, cast the 146th vote for Senator Lodge which made certain re-election.

The chief surprise of the day was the transfer of the support of the two Democratic senators from Mr. Whipple to Senator Lodge. A. Lawrence Lowell was the only senator who did not receive a vote yesterday.

At Little Tancook Island, Lunenburg County, N. S., on Tuesday morning, fire destroyed the home of Gabriel Levy and four children perished. It was early Tuesday morning while the weather was intensely cold that the fire broke out. Those in the house were Gabriel Levy, fisherman and farmer, and his wife, and their six children, Halsey, aged 14; Hilda, 6; Steadman, a twin, aged 4, all of whom were burned to death on the spot.

Boatman who was rescued from the fire badly burned, and died Wednesday morning from the effects, and Angus, the other one of the twins, and Hersey who were rescued. Mr. Levy was burned about the back and his six children, the twins, neck and head. The house was a two story one, and three of the girls slept in the rooms on the north side. Mr. Levy, his wife and Mrs. Levy and one of the twins in the south room on the same floor, while the eldest son and the other twin slept in a room on the lower floor.
