The Casasco No. 2 is 75 feet overall, painted white and finished in native woods. She is one of the fleet of twelve now being constructed for the sardine factory.

WILL TRY TO FLOAT VESSEL.

The Boston schooner J. M. Harlow, Captain Lunt, before reported ashore at Quaco, N. B., is still hard and fast. It is stated an effort will be made to haul the vessel off at once. The Harlow left Boston on Aug. 12 for River Hebert, to load lumber. She was built at East Haven, Conn. in 1874 and registers 221 tons.
