Cleared for Baltimore.

The schooner Inca, after having
some repairs made to her hull and her
bottom somewhat cleared, has sailed
for Baltimore to load general cargo
for the Indies.

Gone to Montreal.
The S.S. Lord Dufferin with a car-
go of refined sugar has sailed to
Montreal where she will load a com-
pleting cargo of general merchandise
for the British Isles.

"Jane Palmer" at St. John's.
The schooner Jane Palmer, the
largest five-master afloat, outward
bound from this port to Garston
Dock, was towed into St. John's
harbor last Friday, leaving badly,
by the S.S. Thetis.

"Nellie O'Keefe" Sold.
The schooner Nellie O'Keefe has
sailed from Yarmouth for Cuba with a
cargo of lumber. She has been sold
to interests at British Honduras and
will be delivered there.

The Bluenose Vessel.
The first vessel built in the yards
of John Duffy & Co., Southville, was
launched last week in the presence
of a large number of spectators. The
new vessel, the J. Duffy, is a ten-
ton schooner of 150 feet, has 28 foot
beam, draws 11 feet of water, and
registers 15 tons net. She is built
of native wood and has accommoda-
tions for a crew of 24 men.

Cubist Vessel at Montreal.
The S.S. "War Dream" first of the
"Cubist" war vessels to enter the
port of Montreal, is a ship without a
keel and with not a cork between
frames, sides, deck or stern. She is
the latest product of war shipbuilding
being designed and construction
started the week of the signing of
the armistice.

S.S. Cordova at Chatham.
The S.S. Cordova, which for several
months has been stranded on the
Escuminac reef, has been hauled off
and towed to Chatham. Two of her
propeller blades are broken and her
rudder is gone. After receiving some
marine first aid, she will be taken to
the Halifax dry docks.

Vessels in Distress.
Boston, Aug. 1.—Beginning the new
direct service of the Emery line be-
tween Boston and Buenos Ayres the
str. Lake Flynn sailed today with a
capacity cargo. The shipments in-
clude 400,000 feet of lumber and large
lots of paper, shoes, chemicals and
other manufactured products.

London, July 31.—Str. Arabian
Prince (Br), from New York, July 23
for Aden, Singapore, Manila, etc., re-
ports evening of July 23 sailed in lat
39 30 N, lon 47 14 W, had shaft frac-
ture; trying to make temporary re-
pairs.

Aug. 1.—Str. Columbine, Newport
for Copenhagen, passed by the
dock and signalled had machinery
damaged.

Str. War Quail (Br), from Montreal,
collided with the entrance of the
dock at Glasgow and had bow con-
siderably damaged; is leaking badly
and in danger of sinking; will sail
after temporary repairs.

San Francisco, Cal., July 23.—Str.
Horace Baxter, while making dock in
Oakland, struck by a tug, grounded
and remained until high water, when
she floated; diver sent to make ex-
amination.
