



WALL STREET REVIEW.

New York, March 12.—The week in the stock market was one of almost continuous reaction in more active dealings. Important shares lost 5 to almost 20 points, last year's low records being duplicated or exceeded in several noteworthy cases. Heaviness of rails, due primarily to the prospective scaling down of wages and working forces on a very drastic scale was the most disconcerting feature. Some of the gilt-edged transportation with unbroken dividend records, notably Pennsylvania, were among the more reactionary stocks.
