

The single deaks and seats are made of butternut, chestnut, red cedar, spruce, cherry, bird eye maple, hemlock, oak and white maple. A number of the single deaks have folding seats and top, and turned rungs. The deaks when folded occupy a space of only about 6 or 8 inches. They have nine single deaks one for each grade made of white maple with patent adjustable irons. Besides these there are several double deaks suches as are used in many of the country schools made of ash with folding seats. The lady teacher's deak is a very pretty one made of white maple with bird eye panellings and covered with scarlet. The display of furniture is a most creditable one and reflects the highest credit on the manufacturers. The casting for the desks was done at the New Brunswick Foundry, and the coloring was done by Mr. Wm. Sutherland.

The furniture may be seen for a day or two longer at Mr. Sutherland's ware rooms on Queen Street, opposite Bank of British North America.
