

MARTIN, *Hon. GEORGE BOHUN (North Yale).*

S. of the late Capt. G. B. Martin, C.B., Royal Navy, Isabella Harriet, only dau. of the late Admiral Sir Thomas Riggs, K.C.B. B. in Eng., 25 Dec., 1842. Ed. at Cheltenham, Eng. Is engaged in farming and cattle raising. First returned to Leg. Assem. at election held 13 Oct., 1882, to fill vacancy created by the death of the mem. elect, Mr. P. Bennett. Re-elected at g. e., 1886, 1890 and 1894. Sworn of the Executive Council, and apptd. Commr. of Lands and Works, 4 March, 1895. MUTTER, *Major JAMES MITCHELL (Cowichan-Alberni).*

Eldest s. of James Mutter, Esq., J.P., of Bowmore, Islay, Argyllshire, Scot. B. at Keppoch Hill, near Glasgow, 8 April, 1845. Ed. at parish school, Islay, Irvine Royal Academy, but chiefly by private tuition. M., 1873, Isabella, dau. of Alex. Morrison, of Kilsyth, Scot. Is a farmer. Major (retired) of Argyll and Bute Artillery; J.P. and Commr. of supply for Argyllshire. Is Presdt. of Cowichan and Salt Spring Island Agric. Assoc. First returned to Leg. Assem. at g. e., 1894. POOLEY, *Hon. CHARLES EDWARD, Q.C. (Esquimalt).*

S. of Thomas Pooley, Esq., of Upwood and Somerton, Huntingdonshire, Eng., and of Sarah, dau. of Thos. Brighty, Esq., of "The Wight," Huntingdonshire. B. at Upwood, 9 Feb., 1845. Ed. at Huntingdon and Bedford Grammar School. M., 16 Nov., 1869, Elizabeth, only dau. of William Fisher, Esq., of Esquimalt, late of Elm House, Liverpool, Eng., merchant. Apptd. Deputy Registrar Gen. of B.C., Clerk to Atty.-Gen., and Deputy Reg.-Gen. of the Supreme Court B.C., 12 Jan., 1863; subsequently Registrar of the Supreme Court until 1 May, 1879, when he resigned. Is a Barrister at-Law and a Bencher of the Law Soc., B.C. Apptd. Q.C., 7 June, 1888. First returned to Leg. Assem. at g. e., 1882, and re-elected at g. e., 1886, 1890 and 1894. Apptd. Speaker of the Assem., 24 Jan., 1887. Resigned the Speakership, and apptd. Presdt. of the Executive Council, 4 Aug., 1889. A Conservative.—"*Fernhill, Esquimalt; Union Club.*"
