

GIGAUT, GEORGE AUGUSTE. (*Rouville.*)

S. of Pierre Gigaut, by Margaret Wait. Brother of the Rev. F. Gigaut, R.C. Priest of Lowell. B. 23 Nov. 1845, in St. Mathias. Ed. at St. Hyacinthe College. M. at Belœil, 12 July 1870, to Miss Isabella Dillon. Was admitted as Notary on 16 Oct. 1867; a mem. of the Board of Notaries for the Prov. of Quebec for 3 years. Was Mayor of St. Cesaire from Jan. 1875 to Jun. 1878. Was Postmaster of St. Cesaire from Dec. 1870 to Feb. 1874. While Mayor, was instrumental in having waterworks built in St. Cesaire. First returned to Parlt. at last g.e. A Conservative, and in favor of a Protective Tariff.—*St. Cesaire, P.Q.*

GILLIES, JOHN. (*North Bruce.*)

Is Reeve of Elderslie, and has been Warden of Bruce. First returned to Parlt. for present seat, at g.e. 1872; re-elected by acclamation at g.e. 1874; re-elected at last g.e. A Liberal.—*Paisley, Ont.*

GILLMOR, Hon. ARTHUR HILL. (*Charlotte.*)

S. of Daniel Gillmor, Esq., J.P., of St. George, N.B.; and grands. of Arthur Hill Gillmor, Esq., of Hillsborough, Co. Down, Irel. B. at St. George. Ed. there. M. 1846, Miss Howe, of Maine, U.S. A mill-owner. Sat for Charlotte, in N.B. Assembly, from 1854 until 1866, when defeated on Confederation question. Was Provl. Secy. in Mr. A. J. Smith's Anti-Confederate Govt. 1865. Contested Charlotte unsuccessfully for House of Commons at g.e. 1872. First returned at g.e. 1874; re-elected at last g.e. A Liberal.—*Broadway, St. George, N.B.*

GIROUARD, DESIRE, Q.C., D.C.L. (*Jacques Cartier.*)

B. at St. Timothé, Co. Beauharnois, 7 July 1836. Ed. at the Montreal College, and graduated in law in McGill University, from which he has received the degrees of B.C.L. and D.C.L. Called to the Bar of Lower Canada, 13 Oct. 1860, and made Q.C. in 1876. M. 1st, Mathilde Pratt, dau. of the late John Pratt, and 2nd, Essie Cranwell, sister of Samuel Cranwell of New Orleans. Author of Treatise on Bills of Exchange, the Insolvent Act, Laws of Marriage, &c., &c. Founder, with W. H. Kerr, Q.C., and other leading
