Explains No Increase The rehabilitation scheme, as originally conceived, had the task of getting approximately a million veterans back into civilian life, he went on. "We hoped to do this by 1950, and expected that it would cost a billion and a half dollars," the minister said. To date the program has run very well and it will probably cost as much as originally expected

Of the million veterans about 58,000 have received university training, 100,000 have taken vocational training, 40,000 have taken land grants and the rest came back into civilian life under the re-establishment grant, the minister said. "It cost about \$4,000 for each stu-
