

Mississauga Paddlers Overwhelm Opposition

The Mississauga Canoe Club dominated the Western Division's season-opening meet at the Toronto Sailing and Canoe Club last weekend. The MCC's powerful showing cast aside any doubts which may have existed in regard to their ability to repeat as the top club in this division this year. If anything, they looked even stronger on the basis of their performance in this outing. Mississauga chalked up a

total of 127 1/2 points to finish far ahead of the second place West Rouge club who finished with 79 points. Balmly Beach end up in third place with 67 points followed by Burlington Mohawk CC with 38 1/2 and the Toronto Sailing and Canoe Club with 35. Mark Butler, Hans Nishan, Rick Bell and John Nasato won two events for the Mississauga Club. Butler and Nishan won the senior

kayak tandems then teamed up with Bell and Nasato to win the kayak fours. Bell also won the junior kayak singles and then he and Nasato joined with Ross Burkimsher and Bob Brymer to take the junior kayak fours competition. The powerful MCC registered four more wins in the non-scoring women's and bantam classes. Joanne Kelly won the kayak singles and was also in the winning war canoe crew. Bob Boaz won the canoe singles and teamed with Rick Skala to capture the canoe tandem honours.

Two of Mississauga's top paddlers, Dean Oldershaw and Bill Collins, won the senior canoe tandem. The paddlers move to the Credit River in Port Credit this Saturday for their annual meet here.

overall plan for the remainder of the Woodlands subdivision.

Last week, approximately 200 residents of this area turned out at the Port Credit Secondary School auditorium to hear their council, Jim Beattie, put their views forward in regard to the density problems in the Woodlands.

Mr. Beattie made a plea to protect the ratepayers of this subdivision from a position of "extreme peril".

Planner Norman Pearson told the crowd that "the

zoning was extremely open and that council was wise to stop the issuance of further permits until some satisfactory plan had been agreed upon.

"There is a definite density problem there," he said, "as well as an acute shortage of general parkland."

Negotiations will continue on the future plans for Erindale Woodlands before any further building permits are issued for this area, council ruled.

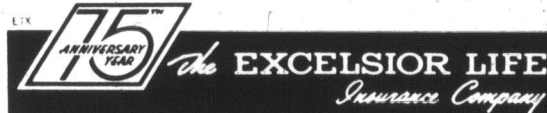
Local Rovers To Attend Swedish Moot
