	Thursday Dec.18th/41		Two civilians employed as G. D.'s. Three others interviewed and engaged to report 29-12-41. A.F.R.O. 941/41 Drinking in Public Conveyance, and A.F.R.O. 1381/41 Railroad Safety Precautions and a Station Report on the results of the War Certificate Campaign were read to all Station Personnel on the C. O. weekly Station Parade.	
Friday Dec.19th/41		One civilian engaged to report 29-12-41 advised he would not be available as he had obtained another job. A fire drill took place at 1305 hours attended by the Mayor of Belleville. Personnel carried out the Station Standing Orders in 3 minutes while the local fire department responded in 4 minutes.
