he cannot get out of his place without passing over the reserve, Mr. Boucher on that account ask to the Department the right to make a road for himself at his own expense and to fence it, passing through an uncultivated ground on a length of seven acres from the east to the west to join the main road on the reserve and this would not injure the Indians.

I have also left medicine there and the general sanitary is very good. Regarding the school I had an interview with Revd Father Bailey who says that Indians are making fair progress, but white people with the approbation of the priest and the School Inspector, Magistrate Simard, would like to have the Department build a school
