Dear Sirs:

Would you kindly arrange to have forwarded to me, at The Roxborough, Ottawa, by Dominion Express, at once if possible, the oil paintings at present stored in your warehouse in my name.

There is a large portrait of my father, and one of my mother; also two smaller portraits of my grandfather and grandmother; one oil portrait of myself; and two large oil paintings, one a scene in Surrey, and the other a waterfall in some other part of England. They are all ready packed for shipment. I think the contents of the boxes will be apparent from what may be written on the outside. Should the boxes contain more paintings than those herein indicated, I should like to have the extra ones forwarded as well. I am not anxious, however, to receive at the present time to receive the pictures which are framed in glass, and which are separately boxed. I should be greatly obliged if you would arrange this shipment for me. I think all the pictures are where they can be readily removed by the Express Company.

I enclose a duplicate of this letter, which you can transfer to the Dominion Express Company, should they wish direct authority from me for the shipment.
