Wingham, Nov. 13th, 1912.

I have your letter of the 11th inst.re  
Voters List revision. The Voters' lists for Wingham,  
Morris, Blyth, Wroxeter, Turnberry and East Wawanosh were  
properly looked after from Wingham. We struck off every  
Conservative voter who was not qualified to vote and also  
added every Liberal voter whose name had been omitted  
from the list. I did not keep any account of the actual  
number of put ons or strike offs for either party.

JULY 2nd

O.K.Watson Secretary ( Provincial) asks for revision forms.  
Lists being attended to.

JULY 1st

Organizer Adams conferred with W.R.Ferguson M.P.P. and  
stated that his revision was in good shape and he would  
not require assistance. Ferguson is the probable candidate  
again. D.A. Gordon M.P. will also co-operate as to the  
lists and is probable candidate for the next campaign.

JULY 20th

W.R.Ferguson M.P.P. orders supply of revision forms and  
is attending to lists.

AUGUST 15th

Organizer Adams reports that he visited Wallaceburg. D.A.  
Gordon was away temporarily, and Adams conferred with Gordon's  
organizer and principal business associate T.B.Dundas, and  
is also with Herb McDougal who is president of the Town  
Association, and John Zabitz. They stated that East Kent  
lists are always well revised and will be so this year. They  
said however, that Chatham and Zone Townships would be given  
extra attention as an improvement was required. It is assumed  
here that Gordon will again be the candidate, but should  
he ultimately decline, T.B.Dundas is regarded as the strong-  
est man in sight. He would hold Gordons following Con-  
servatives, who are employed in the Sugar Refinery and the  
Glass Worke here. Gordon and Dundas are the principal men  
in this concern. It is necessary to obtain this following  
to hold East Kent. The Conservatives Party have a strong  
candidate in prospect- A.B.Carscallen a barrister of  
Wallaceburg.
