**Archibald McGillivray,  
Native of Ripley, Dies  
at Winnipeg, Aged 62**

Winnipeg, Oct. 13.—(CP)—Archibald McGillivray, 62, deputy minister of public works in the Manitoba Government and provincial highway commissioner, died at his home here today after a lengthy illness.

In the Government service for 32 years, Mr. McGillivray had been confined to his home for the past three months.

Born at Ripley, Ont., in 1874, Mr. McGillivray, after receiving a public school education there, later attended Wetham College in Vancouver. In his younger days he did considerable mining engineering in the Caribou and West Kootenay districts of British Columbia.

His widow, two sons, three daughters and a sister, Lady McBride of Victoria, widow of Sir Richard McBride, survive.
